BOARD RESOLUTION 2015-05**

A RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT FROM THE HAMPTON ROADS TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ORGANIZATION FOR PROJECTS TO BE SUBMITTED FOR EVALUATION UNDER THE HOUSE BILL 2 (HB2) PRIORITIZATION PROCESS.

WHEREAS, House Bill 2 (HB2), signed into law in 2014, directed the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) to develop and use a prioritization process to select transportation projects;

WHEREAS, following a year of development, which included multiple stakeholder sessions across the state, the CTB approved the HB2 prioritization process on June 17, 2015;

WHEREAS, the HB2 process specifies eligible applicants for three project types – Corridors of Statewide Significance, Regional Networks, and Urban Development Area;

WHEREAS, Local Governments submitting projects under the Corridors of Statewide Significance category and Transit Agencies submitting projects under the Corridors of Statewide Significance and Regional Networks categories require a resolution of support from the relevant regional entity;

WHEREAS, James City County has requested an HRTPO Resolution of Support in accordance with HB2 requirements; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the *HRTPO Guidance on House Bill 2*, approved by the HRTPO Board on July 16, 2015, HRTPO staff has reviewed the proposed projects and found that they are consistent with the current, fiscally-constrained Long-Range Transportation Plan and, if applicable, the fiscally-constrained Transportation Improvement Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the HRTPO hereby supports the following projects to be submitted for evaluation under the HB2 Prioritization Process:

- Longhill Road Improvements – Phase 1, from Route 199 to Olde Towne Road
- Route 60 Relocated and Skiffes Creek Connector
- Route 60 Multimodal Improvements, from James City County Fire Station #2 to James City County Elementary School
