BOARD RESOLUTION 2016-05**

**A RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT FROM THE HAMPTON ROADS TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ORGANIZATION FOR PROJECTS TO BE SUBMITTED FOR EVALUATION UNDER THE SMART SCALE PRIORITIZATION PROCESS.**

**WHEREAS**, House Bill 2 (HB2), signed into law in 2014, directed the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) to develop and use a prioritization process to select transportation projects and that the CTB approved the HB2 prioritization process on June 17, 2015;

**WHEREAS**, the HB2 process, now named SMART SCALE, specifies eligible applicants for three project types – Corridors of Statewide Significance, Regional Networks, and Urban Development Area;

**WHEREAS**, Local Governments submitting projects under the Corridors of Statewide Significance category and Transit Agencies submitting projects under the Corridors of Statewide Significance and Regional Networks categories require a resolution of support from the relevant regional entity;

**WHEREAS**, Gloucester County has requested an HRTPO resolution of support in accordance with SMART SCALE requirements; and

**WHEREAS**, in accordance with the **HRTPO Guidance on SMART SCALE**, approved by the HRTPO Board on July 16, 2015 and updated in August 2016, HRTPO staff has reviewed the proposed projects and found them to be consistent with the current, fiscally-constrained Long-Range Transportation Plan and, if applicable, the fiscally-constrained Transportation Improvement Program.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the HRTPO hereby supports the following to be submitted for evaluation under the SMART SCALE Prioritization Process:

- Pedestrian Improvements on Route 1208 (Greate Road)
- George Washington Memorial Highway Widening: Farmwood Road to Guinea Road
- Route 614 (Hickory Fork Road) Reconstruction: Route 616 to Route 631
- Pedestrian/Streetscape Improvements on Route 17B
